Siberian Horse: A Climate Hero

Tara wondered who could save the permafrost from melting and decided to search the internet. The answer she found went beyond her wildest dreams: the most unusual climate hero was the Siberian Horse! According to a report by Nina Pullano in INVERSE magazine, these adorable animals may protect thawing permafrost.

Scientists have warned that if global warming is not controlled, half of the world's permafrost will be lost by 2100.

The thawing of permafrost would

solution, and in this case, herds of
Siberian horses may hold the answer.
When there is heavy snowfall, the
permafrost covers the ground like a
blanket and insulates it from cold air.
Grazing animals like horses stomp and

kick up the snow, resulting in the

atmosphere. When there is a problem, there is a

permafrost remaining frozen. A report published in the journal Scientific Reports showed that over twenty years, when one hundred animals were moved to a one square kilometer area, the snow cover was reduced by half.

Without control, the cycle of melting permafrost releasing CO2 leading to further warming which leads to more melting of permafrost releasing more CO2 would

continue. Uncontrolled, this would cause the temperature to rise by 3.8 degrees Celsius by the year 2100. However, with

intervention from Siberian horses, this

temperature could slow to 2.1
degrees Celsius. Other grazing
animals of frozen areas like the
Arctic, such as bison and
reindeer, can also help protect the
permafrost. Together, these herds of

grazing animals can help preserve around

eighty percent of the thawing soil.

Tara loved all animals and now discovered how they played a significant role in

protecting our ecosystem. She often dreamed of visiting a rocky mountain to see the ibex, a wild goat that could climb an almost vertical mountain side. She began to dream of visiting the Dhofar mountains.
